**\*Do not break yarn** – continue working

#### **Knitted on BORDER EDGE**

The border is worked vertically at 90° angle to main body of shawl. On left-hand needle cast-on 14sts using two needle method, provisional cast-on or cable cast-on. With right side facing – with work/shawl in your left-hand, work as follows:

#### **STRAWBERRY PATTERN**

**R1:** k3, (k2tog, yo)x2, k4, yo, k2tog, **k2tog** (taking one st from main shawl) **turn**

**R2:** p to end of row, **turn**

**R3:** k2, k2tog, yo, k3, yo, k2tog, k2, yo, k2tog, **k2tog** (taking one st from main shawl), **turn**

**R4:** p to end of row, **turn**

**R5:** k4, yo, k3tog, yo, k4, yo, k2tog, **k2tog** (taking one st from main shawl), **turn**

**R6:** p to end of row, **turn**

Repeat these 6 rows **191** more times (192 times in total) – *eating-up one st per 2 rows* worked over 1,152sts in total.

For **FINE SPARKLE** repeat these 6 rows **95** more times (96 times in total) – *eating-up one st per 2 rows* worked over 576sts in total.

Using a flat seam sew the 14sts cast-on to the last 14sts on the cast-on edge.

Sew-in seam ends and cast-on tail neatly, hand-wash and rinse shawl in warm water. Roll shawl in a large towel and press gently to remove water. Spread shawl into round shape on a rug or bed and pull the edge firmly to define shape, if you want a perfect circle pin in place. Leave until completely dry.
